1. CALL TO ORDER

The Special Meeting of the Board of Directors of JAMES IRRIGATION DISTRICT ("District") was held Thursday, October 17, 2024, in the District office located at 8749 Ninth Street, San Joaquin, California. The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m., by President, Riley Chaney. A quorum was at all times present and acting.

2. ADDITIONS / CORRECTIONS TO THE AGENDA

There were no corrections/additions to the Agenda.

3. POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST [FPPC §87105]

Directors were given an opportunity to identify potential conflicts-of-interest with items appearing on the Agenda. None were reported.

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Members of the public were given an opportunity to directly address the Board to comment on any item of interest before or during consideration of the item. There were no comments offered at this time.

5. OTHER BUSINESS

a. <u>MOMENT OF SILENCE</u> was observed to honor the passing of FRANK ELLSWORTH "BUCKY" MORROW III, (1947-2024), husband of landowner, Beverly Niboli Morrow.

6. BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MEETING

The Board of Directors convened as a Board of Equalization to hear public comments regarding objections to the valuation, acreage, or any matter pertaining to the 2024-25 District Assessments.

Background: On October 12, 2021, pursuant to majority vote of District landowners, the Board adopted Resolution 2021-05 which authorized scheduled increases in assessments. The Resolution further stated, "...The Board is authorized to increase these maximums in each of the following six assessment years by no more than the rate reflected on the schedule below. In the event the District forgoes an increase in a given year, the Board may recover that increase in a subsequent year."

To date, the Board has elected to maintain the 2021-2022 rates and has not invoked incremental increases per the approved schedule.

The Board convened as a Board of Equalization at their Regular Meeting on October 8, 2024. Seeking greater public participation, they deferred action on levying the 2024-2025 annual assessments and scheduled today's Special Meeting. Landowners and growers were notified and encouraged to participate in today's discussion. Discussions with Board members and members of the public resulted in revised Budget Projections by refining categorization of "fixed" versus "operating" costs. Copies were distributed for review. (Att.1)

Numerous comments followed:

- Director Motte noted approximately one-half of the District is planted to permanent crops where irrigation is assured. However, increasing fallowed acreage is adversely impacting the District's cash flow. He suggested 1 acre-foot per acre/\$185.00 be charged to fallowed lands. General Counsel, Alan Doud cautioned, "The District cannot charge for a service not rendered".
- President Riley Chaney stated assessments should cover "fixed" costs and should be borne equally by all landowners. A spirited debate ensued over what constitutes a "fixed" versus "operating" cost.
- Salvador Parra, Jr., commented incremental increases of \$10/year would have been easier to tolerate rather than a single \$30 increase.
- Director Andrew Groppetti indicated, "Assessments should provide sufficient income to keep the District open and viable even if no water is sold".
- Director Cory Carvalho expressed his hope that the District could stabilize its cash flow by increasing assessments rather than having to rely on continuously fluctuating water sales.

Cory Carvalho, <u>SECONDED BY</u> Director Robert Barcellos, to <u>APPROVE</u> 2024-2025 annual assessments be levied against lands within the District pursuant to landowner vote and adoption of Board Resolution 2021-05 on October 12, 2021, in accordance with California Water Code §25650 as follows:
